Active	 I will keep my mind and body active by: Accessing the Wellbeing and Counsellor online resources about staying well Speaking to someone and/or seeking support if I'm not feeling ok Engaging in a daily off screen physical activity
Learners	I will show I am growing as a learner by: • Submitting work to my teacher for feedback • Seeking support from my peers or teachers when I am unsure of learning concepts • Accepting that in the given environment I can only do my best • Working cooperatively with peers and staff during time of change
