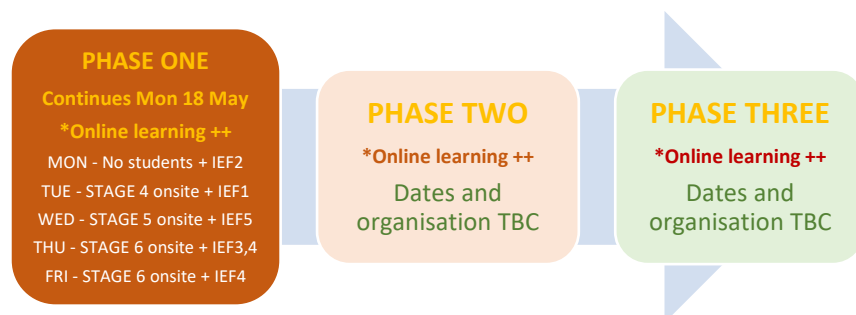


# ONSITE LEARNING @KHS

During Term 2, Week 4 we are committed to continuing to provide a safe and gradual phased return to school for students and staff. Providing **each and every student** with an opportunity to 'connect' with school is important as they continue to undertake some learning from home and some learning onsite at school.

Kellyville High School will return students one day per week, with our Year 11 and Year 12 students coming back onsite for two days a week and Year 12 welcome any day to continue major works or receive other urgent support. This is a considered measure based on maintaining smaller class sizes to support social distancing, staffing allocations and the number of available learning spaces and being able to continue to support online learning from home for all students.



## SCHOOL REMAINS OPEN

Families who need to send their child to school every day may continue to do so and no child will be turned away. Students who attend on days other than the designated 'Onsite Days' will be accommodated in one space in the school, the same space every day. Casual staff will support this group of students to continue with online learning.

## WHO RETURNS FOR ONSITE LEARNING?

The interaction students will have during the Onsite Learning day is the opportunity to engage in face to face learning with a curriculum expert building on the work being covered in the online learning environment.

**MONDAY** – IEF2 + Non designated day students

**TUESDAY** – Year 7 & 8 + IEF1 + Non designated day students

**WEDNESDAY** – Year 9 & 10 + IEF5 + Non designated day students

**THURSDAY** – Year 11 & 12 + IEF3 + IEF4 + Non designated day students

**FRIDAY** – Year 11 & 12 + IEF4 + Non designated day students

# Term 2, Week 4

- Students are encouraged to bring their own device to school to assist with learning where possible. They should also bring suitable work books and any subject specific equipment, along with their own stationery items.
- Students in Stage Four and Stage Five can wear **school sports uniform** on the day they are onsite. Normal uniform expectations apply for senior students.
- The Canteen will be open in a limited capacity for those student and staff who are onsite. Students are encouraged to order prior to the start of the school day.

## ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE

- School buses will continue to run as per usual timetable
- We ask parents to "kiss and drop" students without exiting the car

## SAFETY MEASURES

- Students who are considered vulnerable, or feeling ill, should remain at home 'sick' and will be sent home if they arrive and show symptoms
- Students will be placed in classrooms with approximately 15 students in a space
- Classes are split across different spaces and break times may be staggered to assist with social distancing
- Students are advised to bring a refillable drink bottle which can be filled at the water fountain in preference to using the bubbler.

## STAGE SIX ADVICE

- Stage Six students can come onsite ([sign in as visitor](#)) to complete major works or access individual support by making an appointment with their classroom teacher
- Senior students with study periods on any given line should may go to the library during the allocated period
- Onsite learning will now be given staff priority. Google classrooms will be checked by staff for Stage Six (as with all other stages) every 48 hours to provide feedback and zoom lessons may be held at alternate times to the scheduled student timetable
- Onsite learning will follow an alternative timetable.

## WHAT ABOUT LEARNING FROM HOME?

The current published unit overviews for Weeks 1 - 4 will still be the learning focus for Years 7 - 10 during this time, both with learning from home and with onsite learning.

- When students are Learning From Home, teachers may not be online during their published timetable period, however,
- Teachers will access their Google Classrooms at least once every 48 hours and respond to student questions and provide feedback in a timely fashion.
