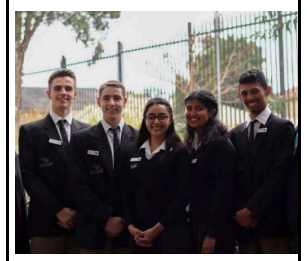

It has been a great experience to finally get to see the school in full swing with the return to full time, face-to-face, classes. I have made sure I spent a bit of time just wandering around and looking at how classes have been going and it has been very encouraging to see how engaged students and teachers have been in working together in these endeavours.

This isn't easy for everyone of course and some students find school life a bit of a struggle at times. While I can't guarantee all the results, I can say with every confidence that we do everything we possibly can to support every student in their learning and wellbeing development.

We are expecting that the current model of school operation will continue at least to the end of term so we have stopped the regular Thursday updates through School Bytes for now but we will certainly let you know when there are changes.

This also means that while we are operating full time, there are modifications to how we run activities like sport, meetings and gatherings.

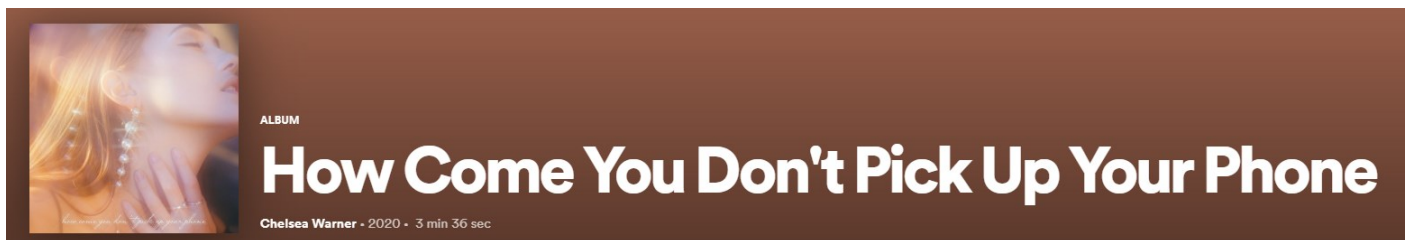
Chelsea Warner Music

Congratulations Chelsea for this amazing achievement and we wish you all the best for your future success!

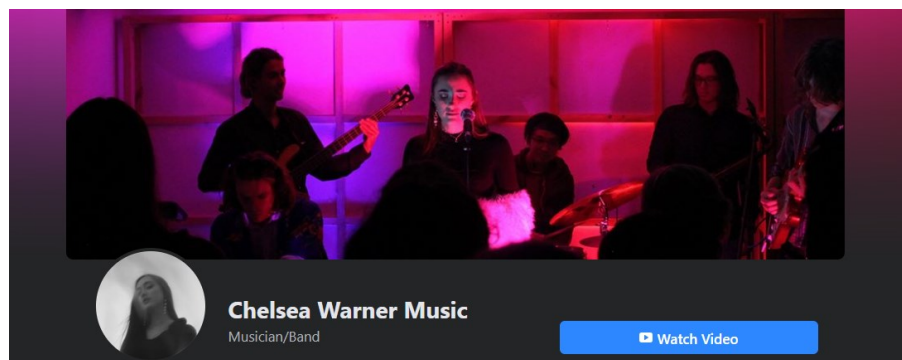
