Deputy Principals' Report

Year 8 & 10 Subject Selection Night

Subject selection will commence at 5:00pm for Year 8 and 7:00pm for Year 10 on Tuesday, 28 July 2020. More information will be forwarded closer to the date.

Study Periods / Wednesday sport

The following reminders are given about the expectations regarding study periods.

The general rule is "one arrival, one departure" on any day.

Study periods should be spent in the Library or in a Cola in a quiet manner.

For study periods in P1, P2 or P5, P6 when you arrive late or leave early you must swipe in on premises - you can do this at the reception (parent counter).

The expectation is on a Wednesday during sport you will leave. If you remain on site, without having a scheduled lesson, you must 'swipe in'.

School Uniforms

A reminder that the school community endorses, supports and expect students to be in uniform at all times. Uniform by nature implies unity and consistency. No variations to school uniforms are allowed.

The current uniform issues that we are seeing are the repeated wearing of leggings and tracksuit pants by students at the school.

Students in Years 7 – 10 will be subjected to school discipline processes and receive a Lunch Detention if they wear the incorrect uniform.

Students in Year 11 or Year 12 will be sent home to change if they are in the incorrect uniform, and are expected to return to school. Parents and carers will be contacted if this occurs.

Uniform is an important part of the development of the school as it presents the first (and often lasting) impression people form about the school and its students. We want our students to be seen in a positive way.

Uniform is particularly important, particularly in these colder months, to allow students to remain safe and warm. Uniform provides security in the sense of easily identifying where students come from.

Economically, it presents a better alternative to buying name brands and lessens the demand to continually upgrade outfits pursuant to the latest student trends and fads. It lessens the competition for brand names that can develop.

Lastly, our uniform promotes a sense of identity, collective purpose, consistency and unity in the daily activities of our students. Wearing it develops pride in achievement and school, which helps to establish the positive culture of the school.

During isolation Year 9 PDM have been busy documenting the lives of a family member through a series of photos.


This challenge was undertaken with enthusiasm as students applied their own creativity to explore different styles, camera settings and the world of their chosen family member.







