<u>Check-in assessment Year 9 - Reading and</u> <u>Numeracy</u>

Kellyville High School has decided to participate in an optional Year 9 reading and numeracy assessment for all mainstream students. Data from this will allow teachers to identify areas of growth and weakness to target more specific needs and cater to the learning abilities of our students. Parents will not receive a report on this, as data will only be used for staff members.

What is the Check-in assessment?

The Check-in assessment is an optional online reading and numeracy assessment for students in Year 9. The check-in assessments will be available to schools as follows:

Year 9 students: Term 3, Weeks 5 to 7 (17 August to 4 September 2020)

The check-in assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

The Check-in assessments are mapped to the NSW Syllabuses and National Literacy and Numeracy Learning Progressions.

The Check-in assessment

The Check-in assessment includes two online assessments for Year 9 students:

- reading assessment
- numeracy assessment

Each assessment is designed to be quick and easy to administer, consisting of approximately 40 multiple choice questions.

From the ARCO

In a multicultural country like Australia, it is important for schools and teachers to recognize racism and acknowledge the beliefs and attitudes of various cultures. Both students and teachers should facilitate cultural diversity and implement anti-racist strategies to promote multicultural education within the school environment. To support this objective and as a part of the Department's commitment to anti-racism, each school has an Anti-Racism Contact Officer (ARCO).

The role of the ARCO is to:

- 1. receive the suggestion, complaint or allegation regarding racism
- 2. assist the complainant to write the complaint, if required
- 3. advise the complainant of their rights and the process to be followed in lodging a complaint
- 4. refer the complaint to a member of the school executive who will be responsible for resolving the complaint.

An ARCO encourages teachers and students to question their own and others' views about racism and suggests practical and positive ways of tackling racism as a whole-school issue. With the support of an ARCO, both students and teachers should be aware of racism and work towards promoting equality and a positive atmosphere. By modifying curriculum and addressing expressions of racism, schools can help students move beyond tolerance to acceptance and nurture an environment that celebrates racial and cultural differences.

KHS school plan has a zero tolerance policy towards racism. Empathy, tolerance and acceptance towards each other is what we need to maintain a healthy relationship in our community.
