DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S INTERNATIONAL AWARD - AUSTRALIA

2020 was a difficult year for us all. Once the smoke cleared from the fires and the flood waters receded, we had COVID19. Few saw it coming, but most of us were unprepared. One thing the Duke of Edinburgh's Award can teach us is the preparation and training is the key to withstanding tough times. Nicholas, Sarah, Thomas, Jefferson, Nathan, William, Lucas, Brooke and Willem were all able to complete their Award levels.

We only managed one Bronze/Silver Adventure Journey last year to Newnes. Unfortunately, numbers were also limited by

National Parks.

In February this year we completed a Silver/Gold Adventure



Journey to Kosciuszko National Park with seven students and one alumnus, "Fantastic week in the wilderness!". Thank you for your help Cassie, it is sometimes the small acts of kindness that make the biggest difference.

After a long drive to Guthega Power Station we had a short but uphill climb to our first night. Day 2 was also quite easy as we crossed the Great Dividing Range. On Tuesday we once again crossed the Great Divide, but this time was cross country passing over Gungarten Pass at 2,020 m elevation. An exhausting 5 km that took over 4 hours, but the views from

the top and experience of visiting Tin Hut were worth the effort. A special place that very few people get the chance to visit.



Formal in-class learning contributes to future opportunities, however, the Duke of Edinburgh's Award brings other attributes that young people need to be future ready for the world of tomorrow such as confidence, resilience and adaptability. Life is a teachable moment.

We were very grateful to Mr. Nicholls from National Parks who gave us an excellent presentation on the Kosciuszko Ecosystem and advice on careers with National Parks. Please email Mr. Thomas if you would like a pdf copy. Kindness and gratitude are some of the best behaviours we can develop. Where there is gratitude, kindness follows. Thank you, Ms. Mitai for supporting the girls on their journeys. Without you their adventures would not be possible.

Playground Supervision

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN HSIE

Year 11 Legal Studies - Ms McHardy

Year 11 Legal Studies has been investigating the topic of the Legal System these last few weeks. Both classes have shown a keen interest in sharing their ideas and opinions. They have shown excellent verbal communication skills, including active listening and respectful presentation of their opinions on controversial issues. The students have shown initiative by involving themselves in current events and accessing the news. While it is still early days, both Mr Knott and myself have been impressed with the commitment to their learning that our students have shown to date.

Year 9 History - Mr Joyce

Mr Joyce is using Minecraft Education in Year 9 History to learn about the Industrial Revolution. Students will make farms that are based on the old open-field farming method then enclose the fields and introduce new technology. They will then be able to assess the impact the Industrial Revolution had on the farms.

Year 9 History - Miss Amin

Year 9 History has been exploring the history of revolutions in European societies. In order to understand why some revolutions came about, as a class we have explored the different 'isms' that emerged in the age of enlightenment. In this hands-on activity, students were asked to match definitions, titles and images to the correct category of



'isms'. Students thoroughly enjoyed this hands on activity and were able to visualise the difference between different ideologies.



Year 11 Society and Culture Class - Miss Woods

In Miss Wood's Year 11 Society and Culture class we have been learning about the fundamental course concepts. Students are examining how these concepts can be applied at a micro, meso and macro level and how societies and cultures can be studied under the concepts. Students applied their knowledge in an Amazing Race task around the school. They had to identify information about the schools' meso context and relate it back to the course fundamentals. Students worked in teams to race around the school and collect primary

data. They then collated this data and are about to present their findings. Students enjoyed the hands-on learning and competitively completed the task. There are some excellent communicators and researchers in Year 11 Society and Culture.

✓ Activate your Account!

Make sure your school has added an email to your NESA record or else you cannot activate your account.

- Go to https://studentsonline.nesa.nsw.edu.au/
- Click on 'activate your account now'
- Write down your NESA number you will need it to log on
- PERSONAL DETAILS Check your name, address and contact details

You can add/change your address, email and phone number

ONLY your school can update your name. Your name in Students Online MUST be the same as your legal documentation (for example, birth certificate or passport).

▼ ENROLMENTS/RESULTS - Check your courses

Are you in the right courses? If not, go to your school and get that fixed.

Check the messages down the bottom of the page – Are there any errors in red? Check with your school.

Final tips:

Students Online - Information for Schools

What you need to know about Students Online

Students must activate their account

- To help the activation process, it is very important that schools enter students' personal details accurately on Schools Online and provide an email address.
- To activate their account, students should visit https://studentsonline.nesa.nsw.edu.au
 and click on 'activate your account now'.
- Students are required to confirm their name and date of birth. An activation email is sent to their email address provided by the school on Schools Online.
- On activating their account, students will receive their NESA student number and choose a NESA PIN. Students need to keep these login details safe. They will need them throughout years 10, 11 and 12.

Personal details

- Students should check that their name on Students Online matches their name in their legal documentation, such as their passport or birth certificate.
- Students must contact their school if their name requires updating as only schools can update students' names via Schools Online.
- Students can check and update their postal address, email address and mobile phone number.

Enrolments/Results

- Students should make sure that they are in the correct courses and view any eligibility errors.
- Students must contact their school if they have any concerns.

Certificates/eRecord

- Students can access their free PDF of:
- **eRecord** at any time. An eRecord details the grades achieved to date but it is not a credential.
- RoSA credential after being nominated as a school leaver by their school.
- HSC credential package after the release of HSC results in December.
- VET credentials package.
