#### YEAR 7 VACCINATIONS

Year 7 Vaccinations will occur at Kellyville High School on Friday the 26<sup>th</sup> of March. The CNC Immunisation program usually provides vaccinations for HPV and dTpa at their first visit to the school, however due to COVID-19 this has changed - Year 7 will only be receiving the 1<sup>st</sup> dose of HPV in Term 1. The dpTA vaccine will be adjusted to a subsequent school visit (please refer to attached letter from the Public Health Unit).

On this day any Year 8 students who missed last years vaccinations will also receive their vaccinations.

The School Vaccination Program over the past 17 years has become a normal part of Year 7 life, like making new friendships, getting lost between classrooms, and going on school camp, having vaccinations is just another experience in the high school journey. It is very normal for students to be anxious about having their vaccines. Many recent studies show that students who are better informed about the vaccines and understand the health benefits to themselves and others on getting vaccinated, are less anxious and more motivated to have the vaccines.

Please review video links below. We strongly recommend that these are shown to your child in advance of the clinic to reduce personal and group concerns on what to expect on the day.

they have achieved. The audience was treated to a lovely performance of "Most Girls" by Hailee Steinfeld, performed by Willow Alderton and



Maddison Lim in Year 12. We also heard from our Deputy Principal Mrs Roberti, our Principal Mr O'Brien and our wonderful School Captains Alysha and Tori. You can read part of Alysha and Tori's speech below.

"International Women's day is celebrated on the 8th of March each year. It serves as a day that people all around the world have dedicated to the women in their lives. This day recognises and



celebrates the role of women in our society and their achievements in their respective areas. It gives us an opportunity to raise awareness of the struggles of women everywhere and reflect on the road ahead.

The theme of this year's International Women's Day campaign is #choosetochallenge. The message of this theme is that we as individuals are responsible for our own thoughts and

actions, and it encourages us to make the choice to call out gender bias and challenge inequality. To create an



inclusive world, we all must choose to promote equality and stand up against discrimination.

To fully appreciate the significance of this day, it is important to recognise the struggles women have faced and the effort people have gone through in the fight for equal rights. The actions of the women before us have paved the way for a

society in which all genders are equal, and although we still have a long way to go, it is important to reflect on how far we have come.



In the past, women were confined by the restrictive nature of traditional gender roles, which dictated that a woman's place was at home and suggested that being a housewife was the only option. Everyone, including women, were brought up to believe that women were only suited to domesticated tasks. Over time the barriers women face have moved to the forefront of social change movements, and new directions in political, social and cultural theory have become a possibility. # **Welcome to Students Online**

#### Activate your Account!

Make sure your school has added an email to your NESA record or else you cannot activate your account.

- Go to https://studentsonline.nesa.nsw.edu.au/
- Click on 'activate your account now'
- Write down your NESA number you will need it to log on

#### PERSONAL DETAILS - Check your name, address and contact details

You can add/change your address, email and phone number

ONLY your school can update your name. Your name in Students Online MUST be the same as your legal documentation (for example, birth certificate or passport).

#### ENROLMENTS/RESULTS - Check your courses

Are you in the right courses? If not, go to your school and get that fixed.

Check the messages down the bottom of the page – Are there any errors in red? Check with your school.

MESSAGES – Where all your PDF results will go that you order through Results Services AND your Minimum Standard Results can be viewed here.

 CERTIFICATES/eRecord – Click here if you want to get a free PDF of your eRecord/RoSA/VET certificates or HSC package when you are eligible

#### Final tips:

- Get your NESA student number from your school (it is on your Confirmation of Entry) and save it somewhere you can access any time (e.g. phone)
- If it says it does not recognise the number You may need to Activate your Account
- Once you activate your account save your NESA 6-digit PIN in a secure place
- As soon as you activate log in go to Personal details fix your email to your personal email

# **Students Online – Information for Schools**

## What you need to know about Students Online

#### Students must activate their account

- To help the activation process, it is very important that schools enter students' personal details accurately on Schools Online and provide an email address.
- To activate their account, students should visit <u>https://studentsonline.nesa.nsw.edu.au</u> and click on 'activate your account now'.
- Students are required to confirm their name and date of birth. An activation email is sent to their email address provided by the school on Schools Online.
- On activating their account, students will receive their NESA student number and choose a NESA PIN. Students need to keep these login details safe. They will need them throughout years 10, 11 and 12.

#### **Personal details**

- Students should check that their name on Students Online matches their name in their legal documentation, such as their passport or birth certificate.
- Students must contact their school if their name requires updating as only schools can update students' names via Schools Online.
- Students can check and update their postal address, email address and mobile phone number.

#### **Enrolments/Results**

- Students should make sure that they are in the correct courses and view any eligibility errors.
- Students must contact their school if they have any concerns.

#### Certificates/eRecord

- Students can access their free PDF of:
- **eRecord** at any time. An eRecord details the grades achieved to date but it is not a credential.
- **RoSA** credential after being nominated as a school leaver by their school.
- **HSC** credential package after the release of HSC results in December.
- VET credentials package.

# Parking Rules & Penalties

# Council's Compliance Officers enforce parking signs at your school.

When it comes to the safety of vulnerable road users like school children, drivers found breaking the law will be met with zero tolerance. **When an offence is detected, you will be fined.** 



#### NO STOPPING

**You must not STOP at any time.** Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

**SCHOOL ZONE** Penalty from \$349 and 2 demerit points



#### **NO PARKING**

You can stop only to drop off or pick up passengers or goods and you must not stop for more than 2 minutes and The driver must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

#### SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$194 and 2 demerit points



#### **BUS ZONES**

You must not stop your vehicle in a Bus Zone unless you are driving a public bus. Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

**SCHOOL ZONE** Penalty from \$349 and 2 demerit points



#### DRIVEWAYS

You must not park your car over or block access to a driveway. You can stop in a driveway to drop off or pick up passengers BUT only for less than 2 minutes AND the driver must stay with the car.

**SCHOOL ZONE** Penalty from \$349 and 2 demerit points

#### ATTENTION ALL YEAR 6 STUDENTS 2021 RE: HIGH POTENTIAL AND GIFTED EDUCATION PROGRAM

Dear Parents and Students,

Each year Kellyville High School offers students entering into Year 7 an opportunity to access placement into the High Potential and Gifted Education program.

Entry into the Year 7 program for 2022 will be based on a number of criteria. One of the major components in assessing suitability will be the results of a standardised test – SCOUT (previously known as the HAST – Higher Ability Selection Test), set by an external and independent educational body. Test material is supplied and independently marked by the University of New South Wales (UNSW Global). There is a **non refundable** administration fee of \$25 which parents are asked to pay to cover the cost of the test administration and marking by the University of New South Wales.

Please find below the details for interested Year 6 students to have the opportunity to sit for the SCOUT test at Kellyville High School.

Date:Monday 10th May 2021Time:8:30am - 12pmLocation:Kellyville High School Hall

Due to COVID guidelines, parents and students are to assemble outside the main Administration Office where a Kellyville High representative will escort the students to the hall. Parents are expected to depart the school site at this time. Students will be escorted back to this collection point at the conclusion of the test for parents to collect.

**Details:** There will be a 20 minute recess break during the test, so please send your child with something to **eat and drink.** No Canteen facilities will be available.

Further information will be supplied to parents upon payment.

Please complete the slip below and return it to the school with payment **before 1pm (close of school banking)** Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> April 2021. If there are financial difficulties please contact the school so other arrangements can be made. No late applications can be accepted due to external ordering of papers.
